The Apostle Paul said that he lived "in hope of eternal life, which God, that cannot lie, promised before the world began" (Titus 1:2). His confident expectation was to live forever with God, based on God's promise. The Apostle John wrote, "These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life...[emphasis mine]" (I John 5:12a).

Many do not have this hope, this confidence. The Bible speaks of those who are without Christ as "having no hope, and without God in the world" (Ephesians 2:12). Seeing many
