Preparation makes our plans possible. While we use these two words almost interchangeably, I am speaking here of a plan that is basically a wish and preparation that is the work done to make that plan a reality.

## On the Verge

For several years we have been praying for the development of West Branch in four areas: 1) Information, 2) Favor, 3) People, and 4) Funds. Along the way God has clearly given us answers in each area. For instance, it was big news when we found out we could have a standard septic system instead of an elaborate alternative system. That was information we needed! During this whole process, we have been greatly encouraged by how positive the county officials have been. That's favor! When we did the septic testing, God sent a crazy Russian to dig the test holes (seriously, that's the name of his company-Crazy Russian Septic). He went above and beyond what we expected and helped us find the ground that was suitable for the septic field. That would be an answer in the people category. Also, in the past year, over \$50,000 has come in to help with development. That answer completes the list with funds. These answers to prayer are all important steps on the road to our completing the West Branch development. Yet we know there are many more answers needed. That's what we are praying for, and that's what we hope you will be praying about too.

This spring God has answered more prayers by causing us to take additional steps forward. First, we are now into the water and sanitation permitting process. Second, God has brought Bill & Barb Bach to us from central Missouri to manage the development project. They moved to West Branch in March. As the new project coordinator, Brother Bach is managing the many steps needed to complete the camp project. This includes pursuing leads on equipment and help, getting bids, and dealing with local agencies. He will also manage volunteer work groups this summer and complete "loose ends" projects in the buildings already constructed.

As we look to God to continue to answer prayer, could I ask you to do three things? First, please regularly check the development page of www.westbranchAZ.org for updates. Second, please pray for all four areas of need, but especially the need for funds. Finally, would you pray about possibly helping in this important work? Through giving or volunteering, you may be the next answer to our prayers.


